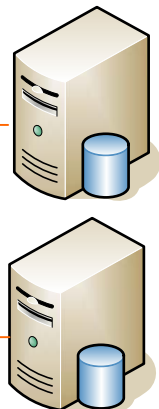
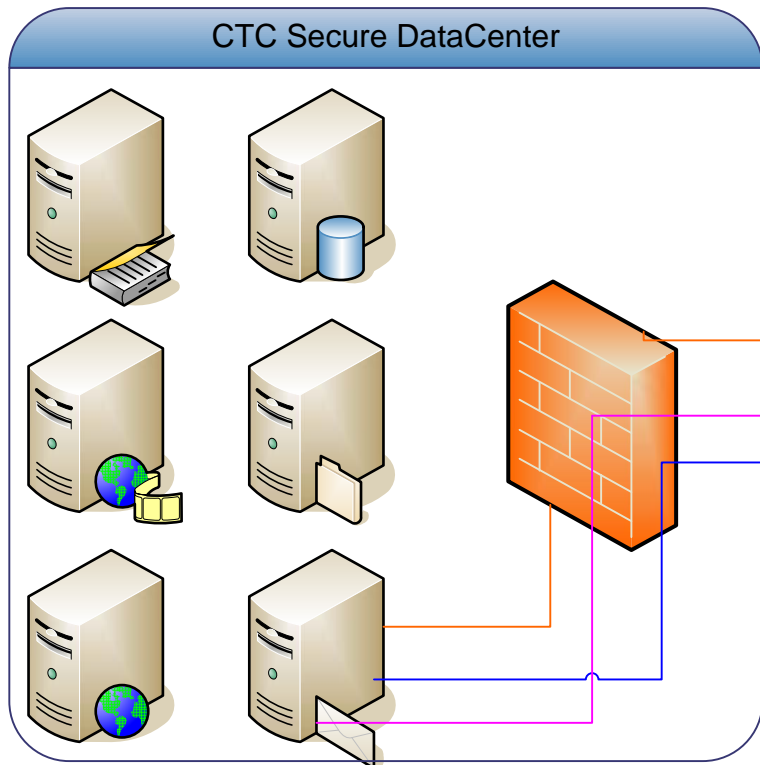


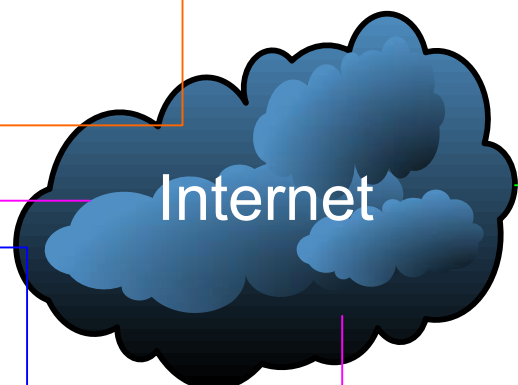
# CTC MailTag System

SLS/Blacklist Lookup Database Servers.

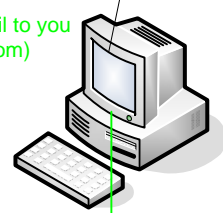

Email flow begins here with someone sending you email.

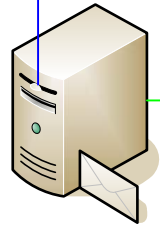
Someone sends email to you (user@domain.com)



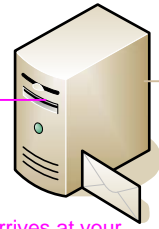
Email Flow

Once email is received by the CTC MailTag System, it undergoes numerous tests to determine if the sending server is on an SLS/Blacklist (which the email is discarded) or whether it is probably spam based on complex algorithms within the system. Known-hostile attachments are stripped and all attachments are scanned for viruses.

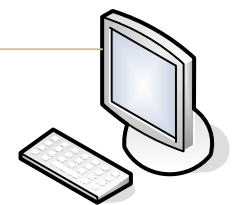
Email gets tagged if our system believes the mail is indeed spam and sent to YOUR email server



Email goes to local or ISP mail server to route to user@domain.com  
MX record for @domain.com points to CTC MailTag Server and is routed to that server.



Email arrives at your server awaiting delivery to your inbox.



Email arrives in your inbox with [Probable Spam] in the subject if it has been tagged. Rules can be setup to take action against email with the subject tagged.
